Skiing at Silent Lake
March 7-9, 2009 \$525



Retracing the Voyageurs' canoe route from Lake Nipissing into the French River, this historic loop offers picturesque landscape and wide-open vistas. All the sights, sounds and smells of the early summer season make this a great time to be outdoors.

June 27-July 3, 2009 \$1050



Enjoy the fabulous scenery of the North Shore with two days camping in Agawa Bay and five days canoeing in Lake Superior Provincial Park, accompanied by watercolourist Martha Bull. Return home via the picturesque ferry from Manitoulin Island.

Beautiful mid-sized lakes and old growth red pine forest make this canoe route one of Ontario's treasures. Incredible swimming, landscape reminiscent of Killarney, and great hiking.

Chiniguchi Waterway
July 26- August 1, 2009 \$1050



Killarney offers some of the best canoeing and hiking anywhere. The striking colour and clarity of Killarney's lakes makes for unforgettable paddling and swimming. Beginning with one night in the George Lake campground this trip is the perfect introduction to backcountry travel.

The recent creation of Killarney Lakelands and Headwaters Provincial Park offers new opportunities to explore the more isolated north west section of the park, and the landscape made famous by Group of Seven artists.

The Massasauga features the distinctive beauty of the lakes and forests that border Georgian Bay. Less than three hours from Southern Ontario, it is the ideal place to begin your backcountry canoeing experience or reconnect with your canoeing past.

September is a wonderful time for canoe travel. Watercolourist Martha Bull will be on hand to paint with those interested in capturing the colour and diversity of the changing season. This trip will explore some of the lakes and islands on the west side of the Park at a flexible pace.

Perhaps the most beautiful campground in Ontario, Killbear never looks better than in early October when fall colours combine with the rugged Georgian Bay landscape. This is an old-fashioned weekend of (car) camping, great for kids, complete with campfire Thanksgiving dinner and all the trimmings. Hiking, paddling and playing on the beach!
